Minor peewee rep Knights win two more

The NobleKing Knights minor peewee rep team, under Head Coach Jim Younker, added two more solid victories this past week.

This team of 11-year-olds defeated East Gwillimbury 5-2 and then Markham 4-1. Stephen Sartor was in net for both victories. The team is getting a strong contribution from everyone, including new members Andrew Begg, JR Venchiarutti, Ryan Lankester, Travis Brinovec and additional goalie Alex Marchese.

Assistant coach Jay Gagnon expressed some optimism after the EG game when he said "the boys are playing well and we should have a good season." He also confirmed there are some plays the team has to work on.

The EG game began with NobleKing spotting the opponents a 2-0 lead early in the first period. Then the Knights delivered five unanswered goals; two each from

from Stefano Alonzi and Steven Peressini, and a single from Thomas Beretta, Stefano Alonzi and Steven Peressini. Zachary Schofield contributed two assists, while Mathew Chung and Peressini had one apiece.

In the Markham game, two of the Knights' goals came from Dylan Fitzgibbon, while Alonzi and Peressini had one each. Assists came from Aaron Kimber, Schofield and Alonzi.

The defensive squad continues to be very solid - helping Sartor to a GAA of 1.67 in his first three appearances. These players include Berretta, Chung, Jesse Schneider, Braydon Jackson, CJ Sifton and Andrew Begg.

The line of Alonzi, Peressini and Schofield has contributed 20 points (10 goals and 10 assists) in the first four games, helping the team to a 3-1-0 record. The

boys play a home game this week against Bradford before heading off to Peterborough for a weekend tournament.

The Knights started their season with a victory.

The team faced Orillia in their home opener and won 6-2. Zachary Schofield scored the first goal of the year, en route to a hat trick. Other goals came from Venchiarutti, Alonzi and Kimber. Four assists came from Alonzi, Dylan Fitzgibbon and Peressini got a pair each and Kimber, Berretta and Chung had one apiece. Sartor was in net for the victory.

The win streak was short-lived, however, as the team suffered a 4-1 loss to Innisfil in Stroud last Thursday. Ryan Lankester scored the Knights' only goal, assisted by FitzGibbon and Kimber. Goalie Marchese was between the pipes.

Wild double Toronto Moose 8-4

The King Wild had a rocky first period Sunday in their match against Toronto Canada Moose, but they got their act together, especially in the second.

They prevailed on the high end of an 8-4 final.

Captain Mike Bodley gave his mates the early lead after just four minutes of play, assisted by Marc Zanette, but the Moose had the lead by the end of the opening frame, courtesy of a short-handed goal and another on the power play.

King put in four markers in the second to take the lead for keeps, although the foes converted a two-man advantage into another marker late in the period, then tucked the puck home just as the buzzer was sounding.

The wild added three more in the third period to ice the win.

All told, Bodley collected three goals, while Zanette, John Sturino, Mark Trost, Brendan Farrugia and Daniel Douglas each scored once. Zanette and Douglas each contributed three assists, Kurt Zdrilich and Ryan Aikins had two apiece and

Bodley and Ryan Williamson had singles.

"I wasn't pleased with the first period," Head Coach Paul Hampton commented, adding they were complacent and "scrambly."

He pointed out this was the first game they had played in two weeks, noting practices get repetitive during layoffs like that.

Having only played five games, the Wild are currently in third place in the Greater Metro Junior A Hockey League standings with eight points. They trail the Bradford Rattlers with 12 and Richmond Hill Rams

with 10.

After a relaxing couple of weeks, the Wild have a busy schedule awaiting them. They will be on the road Friday night to face the South Muskoka Shield in Gravenhurst, then they will be home in King City Saturday for a match against Bradford, starting at 8:30 p.m. Sunday will see them face Richmond Hill for the second time (they played in their first game and it was King's only loss so far). That game will start at 5:45 p.m. Thanksgiving Monday will see the Wild hosting a noon start against South Muskoka.

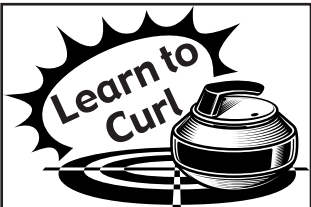
