### Looking for members of seniors' advisory committee

Are you interested in sit-  
ting on a seniors' advisory  
committee?

If so, then King Township  
staff should be interested in  
hearing from you.

Council, last week, adopt-  
ed terms of reference for the  
committee and authorized  
staff to advertise for mem-  
bers after the November  
municipal elections. The  
process will be similar to  
that used to fill other munic-  
ipal committees and boards.

The need for such a com-  
mittee came up at last year's  
King Summit and was rein-  
forced at a follow-up meet-  
ing in March.

The terms of reference  
state the committee will  
form partnerships and com-  
municate with existing sen-  
iors' groups and organiza-  
tions, monitor and review  
general and specific issues  
relating to quality of life for  
seniors in the township. It  
will also provide recommen-

dations to council on social,  
cultural, physical and educa-  
tional well-being of seniors.  
The membership will consist  
of seven people representing  
a cross section of the com-  
munities, and they will serve  
for the term of council (four  
years) with a chair being  
elected annually. It will  
report to council through a  
staff liaison, and will meet at  
least four times per year.

Councillor Jane Underhill  
wanted the membership to  
be mainly, if not entirely  
made up of seniors.

There was also a brief  
attempt to draw them mainly  
from the villages, but several  
councillors had problems  
with that.

CAO Scott Somerville  
stressed the need to look at  
the whole township. Councillor  
Bill Cober agreed, pointing out there are  
a number of seniors in rural  
areas who should be repre-  
sented.

"We need to be very care-

ful of any restrictions we put  
on this committee," he  
remarked.

Councillor Linda Pabst  
didn't want the committee  
restricted to just seniors,  
pointing out a lot of people  
approaching that age could  
offer useful input. She  
agreed people in their 20s  
might not be appropriate, but  
there could be room for peo-  
ple in their 40s or 50s.

Councillor Jack Rupke  
suggested a councillor sit on  
the committee as a liaison.  
Somerville said that would  
be up to the council in place  
after the election.

Underhill suggested the  
committee be called upon to  
make recommendations  
about seniors' financial well-  
being, but Somerville had  
problems with that, wonder-  
ing if it was the role of coun-  
cil to worry about people's  
finances. Specifying some-  
thing like that could put a  
different twist on the com-  
mittee's role, he added.
