WRIGHT: ROBERT WALLACE- Wally Wright died 4:45 am, Wednesday, February 7th of 2007, at RVH of heart failure; his wife and daughters were with him when he died. Born on May 25th, 1921, on the 9th Line of Innisfil, his family had one of the original farms of Innisfil Township. He was 85 years old; he is the last of his immediate family. He is survived by his wife of 61 years, Ina Marie Wright, and his five daughters, Coney Byers, Deanna Novosel, Eva Pitcher, Deborah Wright, Cyndi Smith and their husbands; his nine grandchildren Matty-Jo Wright, Josip Novosel, Allison Pitcher, Kira Gilchrist, Timothy Novosel, Robin Novosel, Devin Van Eldik, Simon Smith and Hannah Smith; and four great grandchildren: Lia Davis, Maddy Novosel, Hollie Davis and Sammy Novosel. He contributed to building the history of Innisfil Township, as a member of the staff who created the 8th Line Innisfil Beach Park, and a man who created and built many of the stone gates, walls and fireplaces in homes in this area. He was a part of the team that worked on the construction of the Avro Arrow in the 1960s and he was the much loved head custodian of Goodfellow Public School for many years, up to his retirement. He was well-liked and well-respected, wherever he worked and wherever he went. He is remembered for his dignity, his wit and humour, his opinions, his strength of will, his pride and his humility, and his affection for his wife and his five daughters, he was a farmer; a stonemason, a craftsman who built his own stone house and 10 acre farm, on the 12th Line of Innisfil, with the help of his wife. He was good with his animals. He was a fisherman, an excellent Euchre player and a gamesman of all sorts. He was a man who knew how to tell a story well and make a joke funny. He was not a social man; he was a very private man, who enjoyed the company of his family, and the pleasures of the outdoors on his farm. He was old fashioned in every sense of the word; he enjoyed living a lifestyle that displayed his old world views. He had principals and values that truly reflected the morals and standards of a bygone era. He was a very important man to his family. He was cremated on Thursday, February 8th, as he wished. His ashes will be buried privately in St. Paul's Cemetery in the spring. There is a Memorial Service, for his family and friends, at the Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses, at the corner of the 10th Line of Innisfil and Highway 27, on Saturday, February 17th at 2 pm. He was an honourable and good man who is going to be missed by those that knew him well and loved him deeply.
