Last Monday night in Aurora, starter Josh Lipscombe practically put the Cobras on his back and carried them as far as he could in King's contest against the first place Jays.

Unfortunately, the weight of the 11 other players ultimately proved too much and the young hurler was taken out after getting into the sixth inning tied 3-3. Lipscombe struck out 10 of the 26 batters he faced before being replaced by Brady Boccia and then Steven LaVerde. Even the Aurora players applauded his efforts as he walked off the mound. By this point in

the game, more than a few of the young Cobras, who have four peewees on their roster, had begun to falter under the pressure of going head to head against an excellent Aurora squad. The tie eventually dissolved into yet another tough loss.

Newcomer Joel Winer started at third and made his presence felt, going one for two, driving in a run and playing solid defence at the hot corner. Centre fielder Daniel Lisi finally got on track offensively with a key hit and scored on an Aurora error, while Boccia and Lipscombe plated the other Cobra runs.

Taylor Joseph, whom the team is counting on to help ignite the offence, once he shakes the off-season rust, showed that his bat skills might be closer to ready than everyone thought as he laid down a perfect sacrifice bunt in the two-run fifth inning.

This was by far the best game turned in by the Cobras to date, and gives everyone hope that better things are in store. At this point in the season, Stephen Leonard leads the pitching staff in ERA, Lipscombe in starts and innings pitched, while Ryan Forletta is tops in hitting average allowed. Defensively, Forletta and Danton Brinovec have the

best fielding percentage; both are over .900. On the offensive side, Lisi and Lipscombe lead in runs scored, several players are tied in hits and La Verde, among the regulars, has the highest batting average.

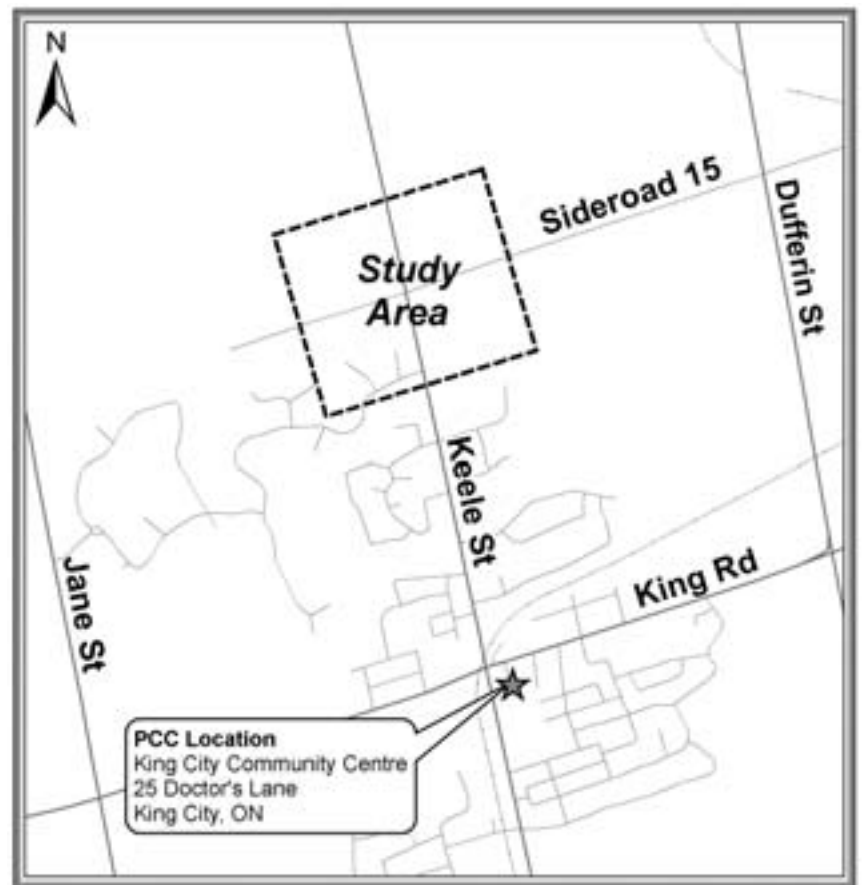

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION CENTRE

### CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT KEELE STREET (Y.R. 6) AND 15TH SIDEROAD INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS Township of King

The Regional Municipality of York is undertaking a Class Environmental Assessment study to improve traffic operations and safety, and to accommodate existing and future traffic requirements, at the Keele Street (Y.R. 6) and 15th Sideroad intersection. The consulting firms of NCE Limited and Gartner Lee Limited are undertaking the study on behalf of York Region.



The project is being planned under **Schedule B** of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* (June 2000) under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. Public and review agencies are invited to provide input and comment for incorporation into the overall planning and recommended design of the intersection improvements.

To provide details on the study, alternatives considered, the recommended design, as well as to receive input and comment from interested parties, a Public Consultation Centre will be held:

York Region staff and their consultants will be on hand to discuss and answer questions on the preferred solution, including the alternative design concepts developed for the preferred solution (as well as their evaluation and the recommended design), and mitigation measures to reduce potential effects on the existing environment.
